2025 An Introduction to Beekeeping

The best introductory beekeeping course in East Anglia! **Begins 3rd March 2025**

The aim of the course is to allow those with no previous knowledge or experience to start keeping bees. **This is a very short course so, if you take it and wish to keep bees successfully, you can't afford to miss a single session.** To underpin the instruction, within reasonable limits, we offer advice and assistance afterwards.

Since most of the course will take place before bee colonies can safely be opened (May to September), it is important that, if you can, you make arrangements to look into a colony of honey bees in the season before the course starts; if it isn't already too late in the year when you read this, we can help; please ask. I cannot emphasise too strongly that there is no substitute for opening an active colony of honey bees with an experienced beekeeper. You might try being stung too!

This year the course will run on five consecutive Monday evenings from 3rd March between 7.30 and 9.30pm. This is the classroom, theoretical, part and will be held in the Dallinghoo Jubilee Hall IP13 0JX. The dates and brief details are listed in the course calendar which should accompany this. Sessions include an afternoon handling lovely quiet bees in on 12th or 13th April from 2 to 4 pm - you choose which - and a grand finale all-day session from 10 am to 4 pm on Sunday 27th April – a day you can't miss.

The fee for our Course is currently £60.00. For two at the same address, we offer the course at half price, but they will get only one set of notes. If you want to take the course but can't afford the fee, please ask - reductions and waivers are available.

The handouts provided will not cover all you need to know. While you are encouraged to borrow books from either public libraries and/or this Association's, you will need one of your own to refer to when uncertain what to do. **At least one general book on beekeeping is essential - start reading and absorbing this as soon as possible.** Two books are better than one as each will have a different viewpoint. We recommend:

- BBKA's *Guide to Beekeeping (2nd Edition)*
- Clive de Bruyn's "*Practical Beekeeping*"

- "Guide to Bees & Honey" by Ted Hooper
- Haynes "Bee Manual" by A & C Waring
- *Get started in beekeeping* by Adrian and Claire Waring
- "Beekeeping: A Seasonal Guide" by Ron Brown.

We suggest you buy yours from **Northern Bee Books**, Scout Bottom Farm, Mytholmroyd, Hebden Bridge HX7 5JS; [Northern Bee Books](http://www.northernbeebooks.co.uk). You will also need a notepad; A4 is best since this is the size of the handouts. Our library also has some good introductory DVDs; please borrow them.

If you are thinking seriously about taking our course, please do not wait until nearer the day but get in touch; places are limited. Not long ago we were fully booked six months in advance; most years we have to refuse late applicants.

Jeremy has been keeping bees since 1985 and is a BBKA Master Beekeeper, currently one of only four in Suffolk. James Ferguson is a Genetics graduate (BSc Hons, Leeds), a professional breeder of pigs & poultry, who is now in 16th season keeping bees and a BBKA Qualified Beekeeper; he is a teacher of Physics & Biology.

As far as we know, our local agricultural college, Suffolk Rural, does not currently offer an introductory beekeeping course.

Those intending to keep bees in Suffolk are strongly advised to join one of the six beekeepers' associations allied to the Suffolk BKA. Membership provides £10M third party insurance cover via the British Beekeepers' Association (BBKA) and a ready source of advice and help. Members are most welcome to attend any Suffolk beekeepers' meeting. See: www.suffolkbeekeepers.co.uk.

Any introductory course can only be the very early beginnings of your grasp of the practical, complex arts of bee husbandry – you should plan to continue to study. If you are not eager to continue to learn, we course tutors will have failed!
